#### Before the Lesson

Review the websites/activities used in this lesson.

- Open each website needed behind the Zoom screen.
- Start the Zoom session 10 minutes before your scheduled start time to support students with tech issues
- Open a White Board on Zoom to post objective and agreements/values.

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# **Vocabulary (Post on chart paper, blackboard, or whiteboard)**

**Alebrije:** are brightly colored Mexican folk art sculptures of fantastical or mythical creatures. (This means that they come from someone's imagination.)

**Background information:** The first alebrijes, as well as the name itself, are attributed to Pedro Linares, an artisan from México City. Pedro specialized in making piñatas, carnival masks and figures from cartonería (a kind of papier-mâché). He sold his work in markets in Mexico City. He became very sick at one point in his life, and dreamt of magical creatures while in bed. He saw a donkey with butterfly wings, a rooster with bull horns, a lion with an eagle head, and all of them were shouting one word "alebrijes." He began creating what he saw in his dreams using Papier Mache. Pedro Linares traveled to see family in Oaxaca México often, and eventually helped artists there learn how to make alebrijes and carve them from wood from the copal tree. Pedro received Mexico's National Arts and Sciences Award in the Popular Arts and Traditions category in 1990, two years before he died. The descendants of Pedro, many of whom live in Mexico City, carry on the tradition of making alebrijes and other figures from cardboard and papier-mâché. Their customers have included many famous celebrities such as the Rolling Stones and David Copperfield

#### **Materials:**

Use this time to welcome your students and establish how you expect them to engage / participate. Review the HS Pillars:

- We are LEADERS inspiring, respectful, innovative, open

Be sure to emphasize:

- The activity will call for self-reflection and sharing out of thoughts, it is therefore imperative that students are actively engaging in the "We are Family" pillar.
- Keep the microphone muted until speaking.
- Be free from distractions. (Quiet place, etc.)

- o What do you like about it?

## Step 3: Objective

# **Establish the Purpose**

**SHARE YOUR SCREEN** to show the White Board with the objective(s) posted.

**ASK** for a student volunteer to read the objective.

**Objective:** "Today we will increase knowledge about alebrijes and design our own alebrije."

# **Step 4: The Activity**

# SAY:

Now that you know a little more background and history about alebrijes you will be given the opportunity to create your own alebrije using your imagination.

OPTION A (4<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup>): Create your own colorful and mythical creature.

- Must include at least three elements (earth, air, fire, sea)
- If it were to magically come to life, what would it be like?

OPTION B (K-3<sup>RD</sup>): Share one of the outlines provided to inspire their own alebrije. (dog/cat/elephant/bird)

- Must include at least three elements (earth, air, fire, sea)
- If it were to magically come to life, what would it be like?

**SAY:** Once your alebrijes are complete you may share out with the group and explain your design Alebrijes are a colorful and fun folk art! We will have a few volunteers to share their alebrijes and tell us about their design/creation.

# **Step 5: Connect the Learning**

# **Check for Understanding**

Use this time to review new ideas, vocabulary, main concepts from the activities. You can utilize the chat so students can enter answers. Allow students to share their experience of the activity. Highlight some responses.

What did you like about this activity? Did you learn something new?


# **Revisit the Purpose**

### **Offer Extension Activities**


- Help someone in your family design their own alebrije

Alebrije Drawing




Alebrije de perro
